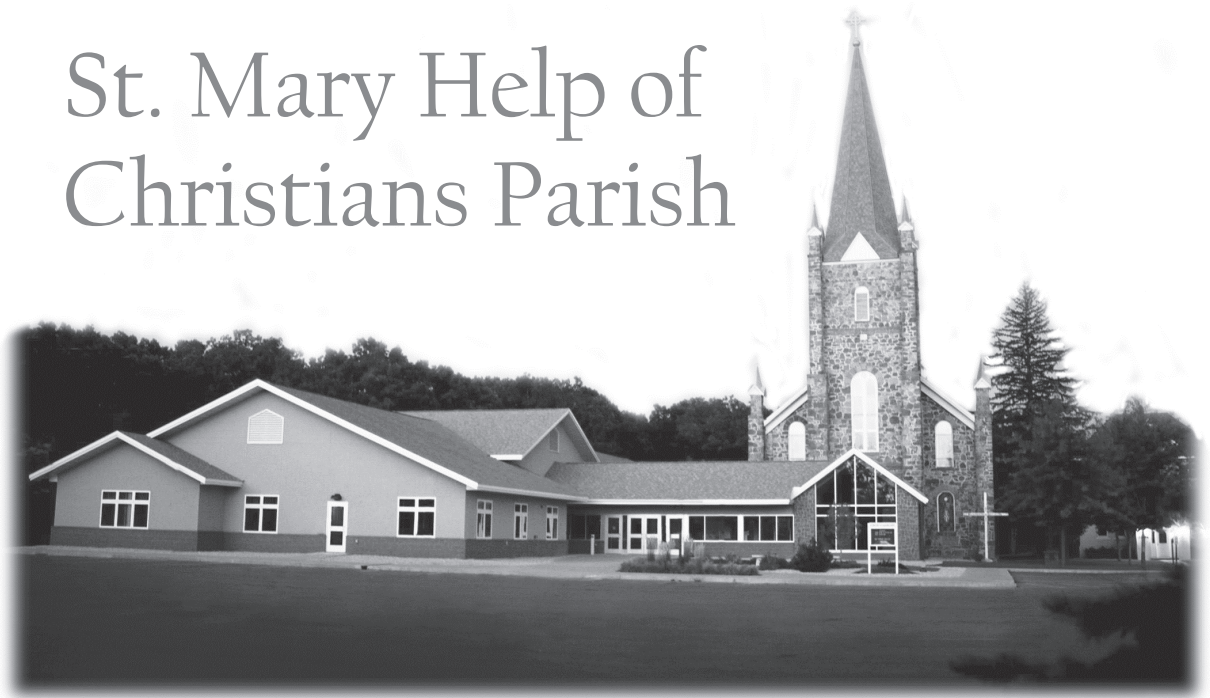

August 9 – 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time - 1 Kings 19:4-8, Eph 4:30-5:2, John 6: 41-51

Jesus said: “I am the bread that came from heaven.” The Jews murmured. They know Jesus’ mother, father and all his relatives. Then how can he say: “I have come down from heaven!” Jesus saying that he is from heaven was a scandalous statement for his God-fearing audience. How can he come from heaven? Today Jesus asks us to go beyond.

“How can I find God?” a young disciple once asked a famous guru. “I cannot see any evidence that He is anywhere around us, and millions of people live very well without him.” “Everything without God happens in space and time. This is the world you are used to,” his Guru replied. “Space and time are like a net that has trapped you, but nets always have holes. Find such a hole and jump through it. Then God will be obvious”.

Jesus asks us to go beyond, go beyond flesh and blood. At Caesarea Philippi, Jesus said to Peter: “Flesh and blood did not reveal this to you. But my heavenly Father.” One who has come from the heaven has given us his body and blood as food for our spiritual nourishment. Today we have to go beyond the bread and wine. Jesus asks them to have faith. His teaching on the Eucharist is very clear. ‘Your ancestors ate manna in the desert, but they died. But the bread that I am, which you eat, is the nourishment for eternal life.’ It is body and blood of Christ who is risen from the dead. Oh! Jesus is clear: “The bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.”

We heard in the first reading about Elijah’s being nourished for a long journey. Elijah is fleeing from Jezebel against whom he has spoken and whose false prophets he has slain. The forty days’ journey to the mountain of God seems too much and he wishes to die. It is a long journey like Israel’s forty years in the desert - the time of temptation and murmuring.

We are on a pilgrimage. We, as with Elijah, are nourished and encouraged each time we gather, to continue towards the mountain of God, the Kingdom of God. It is a difficult journey and at times like Prophet Elijah we get completely exhausted. But Jesus feeds us with the Eucharist. We, as with the Jews of Jesus’ time, have problems in understanding and believing. We, too, murmur. Jesus never seems bent on convincing us, but on inviting us to trust Him, rather than our limited intellects. He asks us to go beyond, beyond the flesh and blood, beyond the bread and wine. It is a call to have faith. It is a call to trust Him who Is.

Jesus said: “I am the bread of life that comes down from heaven... If anyone eats this bread, he will live forever. The bread that I will give him is my flesh, which I give so that the world may live.” In every Eucharist this bread from heaven comes to us. Every day before communion we say “Amen” in response to the announcement: “The Body of Christ” by the minister. What does that Amen mean in our hearts? Is it a faith response to Jesus’ call to receive Him in faith for eternal nourishment? In faith, let us taste and see Him.
