June 28 - 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Wis 1: 13-15, 2: 23-24, 2 Cor 8:7,9,13-15 Mk 5: 21-43

Who is the woman in Mk 5, 25-34?: She had hemorrhages for 12 years. She had approached many physicians, but not only that they could not heal her, but rather the disease became worse. In the process she lost all she had. Her sickness was hounding her. She is desperate and has reached the rock bottom. She was in a desperate search for getting healed. She just wants to be cured and was ready to go any extreme for that.

Her Approach: She is trying just another way to get cured. As an unclean woman she has to stay at home and never expected to be out in the public, but she came up from behind and touched Jesus. Truly, she was blind in her act. But she was being healed. Was she joyful? Why she did not slip away unnoticed? Why she remained there even after Jesus asked, "Who has touched me?" She came from behind in fear and trembling and fell down before Jesus telling the truth. She was in total shock at what happened. It is written: "Jesus, aware at once that power had gone out from him..." The woman too was aware of what has happened and she came to the senses (v.33). The truth has liberated her.

Jesus' Response: God did not keep the graces for himself. He is not holding his blessings back. He is a generous and gracious giver. He just showers them on all. People create boundaries for God. People with faith receive his blessings and graces. It is like the seed that falls in the fertile ground. Faith and trust matter. Also here we find the strategy of Jesus to empower the marginalized and the under privileged, in the way in which he empowered the Canaanite woman (Mt 15:22ff.). Today we find that the sick woman was forced to tell the truth. And the acknowledgment and acceptance of truth in public made her free. She became totally free in her profession of truth. St Ephraim writes: "Glory to you, hidden Son of God, because your healing power is proclaimed through the hidden suffering of the afflicted woman. Through this woman whom they could see, the witnesses were enabled to behold the divinity that cannot be seen. Through the Son's own healing power his divinity became known. Through the afflicted woman being healed, her faith was made manifest. She caused him to be proclaimed, and indeed was honored with him. If she was a witness to his divinity, he in turn was a witness to her faith. ..He saw through to her hidden faith, and gave her a visible healing." The sickness of the woman was a way to give glory to God and she became a public witness of God's healing power. Jesus assuring words "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease" wiped away all the fears from her heart and she became a true and free daughter of the heavenly Father. She found her way in life. She not only received the healing of the body, but a total healing.

Lessons to learn

Journey of Faith: The simple faith of the humble woman is an inspiring model for us to follow in our journey of life. Her faith is a faith that acts. A faith that does not act is a faith that is dead. We need to go to him always. He alone should be our shelter of life.

Energizing presence: Jesus is an energizing presence that heals all. He healed her physical disease and gave her courage, peace and joy. He energized her to come from behind and stand in his presence and tell the truth herself. Jesus freed her to become a brave heart.

Eucharistic Presence: Eucharist is an act of faith. It is not a miracle. It is a divine act. It is more than touching Jesus. It is the communion that transforms us and our lives and ways. Let us be inspired by the faith journey of the woman so that we too can find freedom, courage, peace and joy – that is lasting. **Fr. Jose**~
