Sept 20 -25th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Wis 2:12,17-20, James 3:16-4:3, Mk 9:30-37

"He did not want anyone to know it." To know the fact that he was passing through Galilee because he was teaching his disciples about his death and resurrection. He was spending some special time with his disciples. He did not want the crowd to disturb them because he called the disciples to teach and energize them in the ways of God. But his own disciples did not understand him and further they were afraid to ask him about what he told them. They did not get any clue of what Jesus was telling about, i.e., his suffering and eventual death and resurrection. This was what Jesus intends to teach them.

But disciples had their own concern and preoccupations. They were arguing on the way about who is the greatest among them. Each one wants oneself to be the greatest in the Kingdom. They might have been counting on their own worth. If we really count on the worth of our own, then what remains is only our unworthiness. We have nothing to claim for because everything is a gift from God. Again he began to teach them about how to be first in God's kingdom. The greatest is the least and the servant of all. Turning to the child, he invites his disciples to be like children. Whoever welcomes the least one will be welcoming him and in welcoming him, they are welcoming the heavenly Father. He clearly speaks about the way to be the greatest in the kingdom. This is the way of the Son. Even though he spent quality time with his disciples, they did not understand him. A true disciple is one who understands the heart of the Guru (teacher). So the disciples are to some extent strangers. Are we too strangers to Jesus and His ways?

When Jesus speaks about his suffering, death and resurrection, the disciples did not understand him because they had their own concerns. They were not tuned to hear what he was saying. They were too occupied with the concerns of the world and its gains and losses. Whoever is bothered too much about the concerns of the world will never understand and follow the ways of the Lord. Let us always be tuned to the voice of God and follow his will as it comes in our lives. Fundamentally it is a call to be children of God ~Fr. Jose~


Attention All Young Adults! The Diocese is hosting a first ever young adults day at the College of St Bene-
