Jan. 17, 2016 – 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time - Is 62: 1-5, 1 Cor 12:4-11, John 2:1-11



The Gospel ends with: "Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him." The miracles reveal the glory of God. In St. John's Gospel, miracles are signs. In fact, St. John's gospel has seven signs. Where do these signs take us to? The answer is found at the end of the sentence: "His disciples began to believe him." Miracles are signs that reveal the hidden character of the Kingdom of God, resulting in faith. When miracles are seen as signs, then they will generate

faith. When the people of Israel saw the miracle at the Red Sea, they believed in Yahweh and His servant Moses. Miracles are a call to believe. If they do not lead to faith, then they have no meaning. Miracles that happen around us – the miracles of daily life are a call to believe.

Had I been in Cana would I have taken notice of that wonder? Surely not, unless I had been the servant who drew the water. Even if I had been that, I might have questioned the need of filling the jars, because Mary was an ordinary woman and Jesus had not yet worked a miracle. Why should I care for them. I am impressed with the dutifulness of the servants.

In order that miracles can happen, we need to do as the wait-ers did at the wedding at Cana. They did what was asked of them: "Fill the jars with water" and the rest Jesus did. We have to do such homework: "Fill the jars with water." God transforms not only the water, but us into his own likeness.

The wedding feast at Cana reminds us that nothing is perfect and that we have to invite the presence of Jesus everywhere. Mary shows us the way. She knows perfectly well that we can find the solution only in Jesus. He alone is the solution for all our brokenness and emptiness. We have to invite Jesus' presence into our hearts, minds and families for the true joy of life. If we invite Jesus into our lives of emptiness and frustration with an open heart and faith, we too will become changed persons and God will bless us with the wine of joy. We have only to invite him daily into our lives through prayer. Then he will transform the water of our human emptiness, shortcomings and weaknesses into a wine of divine abundance: an abundance of needed strength, tender compassion, mutual love, trust and hope.

When we find our hearts are empty, recall the voice of Mary: "Do whatever he tells you." He is the way, truth and life.


