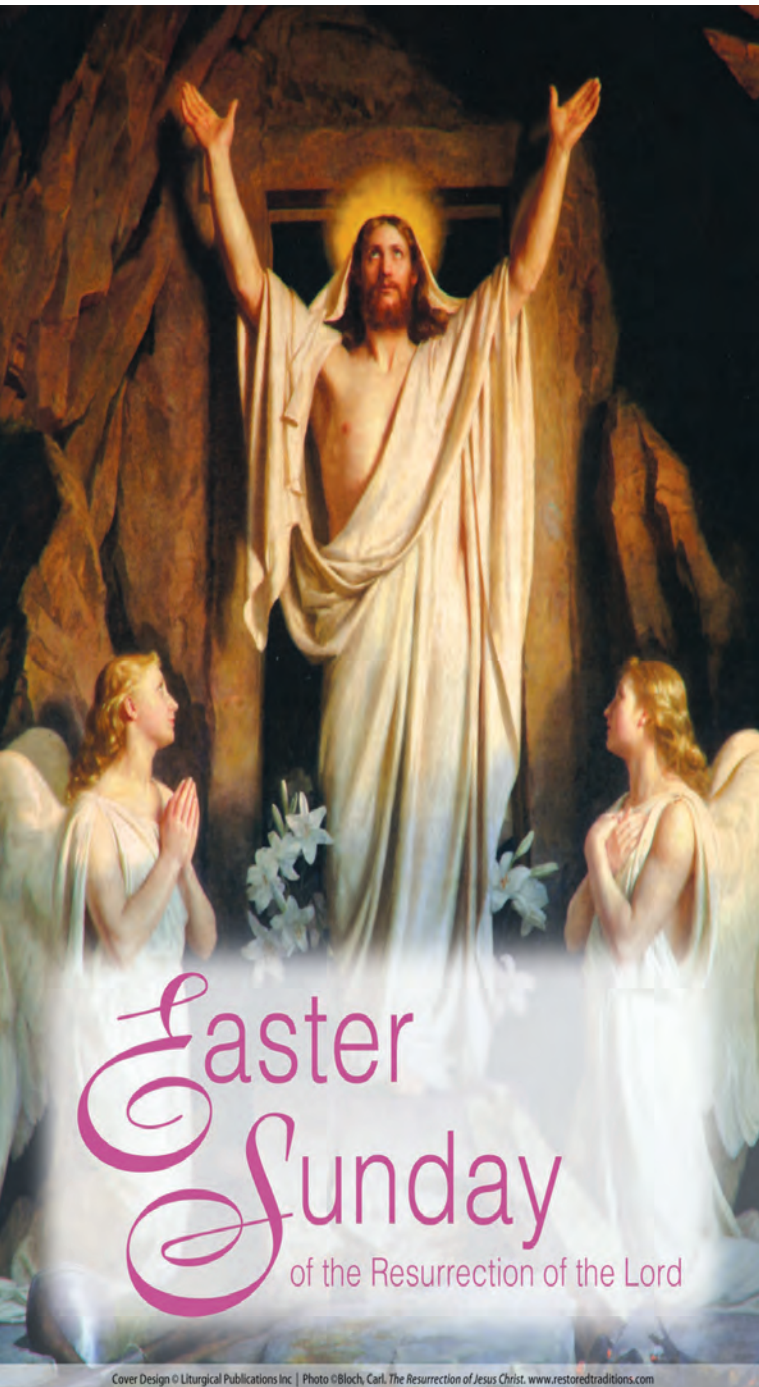

Mk 16:1-7

The three women were at the tomb to anoint the dead body of Jesus: Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome. Where was the mother of Jesus? Her absence from the scene is totally puzzling. Where were all the disciples? This is yet another puzzling issue. Is the presence and absence, a question of faith or of love? For our mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary, her whole life from the moment we encountered the word of God (Lk 1: 26ff) until her end was a journey of surrendering faith, and for her no proof of resurrection was needed.

What motivated the women to be there at the tomb in the early morning, before sunrise on the first day of the week? (Verse 2). It is their love and concern for Jesus. The response of the women vindicates that it is not their faith in the resurrection that prompted them to be there. Like others, they too had not come to believe in the resurrection until that time. They did not expect anything strange at the tomb. They came to the tomb to anoint Jesus' body expecting nothing in return. It was simply an outpouring of love that they had learned from their master. The greatest mystery of life happens at the tomb and women are the first witnesses to the mystery of the resurrection.

The intention of the three women is clear: to anoint the dead body of Jesus (verse 1). But strange things happened which unveiled a radically new chain of events. To their surprise, in the tomb they met a young man dressed in white and they found the tomb empty. The young man asked them to proclaim the truth of Jesus' ever living presence to the disciples and to Peter. Jesus is risen from the dead. They did not understand his words properly. The women least expected this sudden turn of events. But they had love in their hearts and that led them to faith in the risen Jesus. Faith is generated in a gradual way and through the instrumentality of a series of events and persons. Does not love stand at the heart of the journey of faith? Through stages we are led to a deeper and deeper faith to the ever living presence of God. Faith is not a onetime act, but a long process. Let us be sincere and receive the grace of God that gradually unfolds in our life. Like the women, let us also be people of love to embrace the light of the resurrection. ~Fr. Jose

*There will be **no** Faith Formation classes on Wednesday, April 4.*

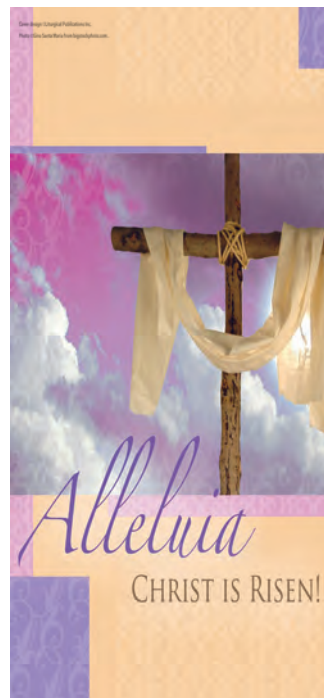
We will have class on Wednesday, April 11 at the regular time. Please bring students directly to their classrooms at 6:30 and pick them up at church at 8:00.
