Mark 4:26-34 (NRSV)

Jesus was a man of parables. “With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it.” A parable was the ordinary people’s literary style during Jesus’ time. They could understand the mystery through the imagery of parables because the parables that Jesus used were at the core of the experience of the people. So it helped them to get the heart of his teaching, especially, those teachings related to the divine mysteries which were otherwise not understandable - beyond the understanding of the ordinary people. In a way, the parables gave flesh to Jesus’ teaching. “Without parables he did not speak to them.” Hence, he was a man of parables and his teaching were for the ordinary people.

Parables are used to reveal the mystery of God. The kingdom of God is a mystery. The mystery of the Kingdom of God is about a totally different world order. To bring home the idea of the Kingdom, Jesus speaks of the mystery of the seed – seed as a parable. The man plants, waters and fertilizes. But the process that is going on within the seed (sprouts, grows, yield fruits, and dies) is a total mystery to the farmer – “he knows not how” (Mk 4:27). The man scatters the seed and he does his share. But the seed grows of itself. We are that seed. The fire/the Spirit of God enables the seed, which we are, to grow. He implanted that spark of God within us so that we can sprout, grow and produce fruits. The mustard seed grows into a huge tree from just a tiny seed. It is a mystery. We are that mystery which can grow to any height. The mystery of the word - it is sown in our hearts and it grows. We need only to do our share meditating over the word – day and night. Then it will grow, giving life and shelter to many. Let us not be bothered about how it grows. But let us prepare the ground, plant, water and manure so that it can grow. As in the case of the heroes of the faith, the word that was planted in their hearts grew enriching many, so in our lives, too, faith is that mustard seed that can grow beyond proportion and imagination. Let the hearing and pondering of the word of God help us to grow in faith day by day having its roots on the ground and branches high up in the sky, serving His children and giving glory to God. ~Fr. Jose
