## Lk 1:57-66,80

The birth of the child of Elizabeth is seen as an extension of the mercy of God, and the people rejoiced at the birth: "Her neighbors and relatives, upon hearing that the Lord had extended his mercy to her, rejoiced with her." God's mercy is seen in the birth of a child. Here it is all the more so, because the child is the gift of God to the parents at an old age, and further, the child is the herald of the Messiah, the promised one. Of the child it is said, "The child grew and matured in the Spirit." Growth is a natural phenomenon provided nature's needs are met. This happens automatically in the animal and human beings. For humans, along with the natural growth, maturing in the Spirit has to take place. As for us, Christian maturity is to become more like Christ through the power of the Spirit. It is to walk in the Spirit, to live in the Spirit so that the Spirit may guide us to be Christ-like in Love and compassion, in knowledge and wisdom, in discernment and integrity, and in obedience and in mission, all for the glory of God. John's training took place in the desert: "He lived in the desert until the day he made his public appearance in Israel."

The desert is the place of encountering God, of walking in the path of nothingness. In the desert, for everything - food, water, shelter, safety, etc.- one has to turn to God. To encounter God means to know that He is all in all - the source and sustenance of everything. It is in the desert of life that we experience God. It is a hard and tough way of knowledge. It is the openness to the Spirit that helps us to encounter the great mercy of God in the desert. God takes us all into the desert of life to speak and to reveal his mysteries to our hearts, guiding us to live in the Spirit. As individuals and as members of communities of God's children we too have to undergo this desert experience to realize that God is all in all. Let us submit ourselves to the Spirit of the Lord so that we may gradually be transformed unto Him. ~Fr. Jose
