Jn 6:1-15

Today we see Jesus turns the problem of feeding the large crowd over to Philip. Philip was saying there was no way they could feed the crowd. As if to support Philip's concern, Andrew pointed out their meager supply telling Jesus that a boy had five loaves and two fishes. Master, it is an impossible task. In human way with human faith it is so. But Jesus' does the impossible. So it is a miracle. But "He himself knew what he was going to do." The disciples did not comprehend it.

The gift we see today in John is meager, but in God's hands, they were ample. He fed over 5,000 people. Not only could God accomplish something with these meager gifts, He could be unbelievably generous. As Jesus tested His disciples, He tests us too. God can do unbelievable miracles with us. It doesn't matter what we give? But it matters how we give? It needs to come from the heart. It will have great worth, like that of the widow's mite. Yes, the world has enough and more for the need of all the children of the heavenly Father, but not enough to feed the greed of all.

Jesus needs our five loaves and two fishes so that he can multiply and satisfy thousands. All of us have that five loaves and two fishes, in some form or other, in our attitudes, in our works of mercy, in our doing service, etc. It is in our faith and good-will to give that makes the difference. It is from our generous giving that the Lord feed thousands.

Today's readings invite us to look into our hearts and to ask ourselves this question: How much of our resources are we currently placing in the hands of Jesus to do with as he wishes? History has pictures of persons that made that difference. Mother Theresa of Calcutta did. Who was she to take care of thousands of people? She was a fragile and weak nun. But in her giving for Christ, in her commitment, in her trust in God, God made her an instrument of his miracle in our age. Dorothy Day writes: "It is exactly the same with our lives. Left alone to face the difficult challenges of life today, we feel conscious of our own inadequacy and afraid of what the future may hold for us. Let us place our lives in the hands of Jesus. He will accept us and bless us, and he will make use of our lives in a way that exceeds our greatest expectation."

Jesus invites us to cooperate with him in faith in working miracles of mercy and giving. Whatever we give him—our time, talent, prayers, sacrifices, resources—he will use them in a way that will exceed our greatest expectations. He will multiply them beyond anything we can dream of, just as he did with the boy's five loaves and two fishes for the nourishment of thousands. Can I be an instrument of God's miracle? Just give to Jesus yourself. You will be storing treasure in heaven. ~Fr. Jose


