John 6: 24-35

There are two kinds of hunger. First, there's a physical hunger, which the food can satisfy. Second, there's a spiritual hunger, which no food in the world can satisfy. In other words, we can be rich, powerful and successful and still feel an incredible hunger inside us.

Deepak Chopra in his book *How to Know God* narrates a story. A great devotee of God prayed night and day with the ardent desire to see God. One day his wish was granted and God appeared to him. Falling on his knees, the devotee cried out, "I will do anything for you, my Lord, just ask." "How about a drink of water?" asked God. Although surprised by the request, the devotee immediately ran to the river as fast as his legs could carry him. Getting there he knelt to dip up some water, then he saw a beautiful maiden standing on an island in the middle of the river. He fell madly in love with her on the spot. He grabbed a boat and rowed over to her. She responded to him, and the two were married. They had children in a house on the island. The devotee became a merchant and grew rich. Many years later, a typhoon came along and devastated the island. The merchant was swept away in the storm. He nearly drowned but regained consciousness on the very spot where he had once begged to see God. His whole life, including his house, wife, children, seemed never to have happened. Suddenly he looked over his shoulder, only to see God standing there in all his radiance. "Well," God said, "did you find me a glass of water?"

This little story illustrates how easily the never ceasing hunger for the world can take over our spiritual search. Israel was saved from slavery to make a nation where Yahweh became her sole ruler. But immediately after leaving the land of Egypt the people began to murmur. "If only we had died..." (Ex 16:3). It shows their unceasing cravings and their lack of trust in the saving God.


As human beings, we hunger for many things besides food and material possessions. We seldom seek for heavenly things in the way we seek after material things. But only God can satisfy our true hunger. St. Augustine said: "O Lord, you have made us for yourself, and our hearts are restless 'till they rest in you." This is why Jesus makes the unique claim in today's gospel: "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst" (Jn 6:35). In Jn 4:13-14, while speaking with the Samaritan woman Jesus introduced himself as the source of living water: "Everyone who drinks of this water will thirst again, but whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst; the water that I shall give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

Jesus knew that the people followed him only looking for material things because he satisfied their physical hunger. He is asking them to look for the food that does not perish, i.e., Jesus himself. Jesus wants the people to recognize the sign that the miracle carries with it that He himself is the bread of life. This is possible only by believing Him as the savior, the Christ. "The work of God is that you believe in the one He sent." The sign, the miracle, is a call to believe. They must believe Him to be the Messiah, the Savior.

The Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life" (*Lumen Gentium*, 11) because it contains the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely, Jesus Christ himself. The Eucharist, the sacrament of faith, is a sacrament of love that unites us with Christ who lived, died and rose again to bring us salvation. It strengthens and makes us holy and nourishes us with the transforming power of grace and prepares us for the future glory of God's heavenly banquet. ~Fr. Jose
