Deuteronomy 6:2-6, Heb 7: 23-28 Mark 12: 28b-34

The word religion comes from the Latin word, "religare" meaning "bind together." Religion aims at bringing people together. The rites, rituals, celebrations and commandments are aimed at that. The commandments call for right relationships – a relationship with God and others. Christianity is a religion of right relationships in love. The Christian mission is all about establishing right relationships with God, oneself, others and the world. At the root of this relationship stands the onepointed relationship with God. From it stems all other relationships. If the first is not sound, then all other relationships will

The often repeated First/Old Testament prayer, "Hear (Shema), O Israel: The LORD is our God, the LORD alone. Therefore you shall Love the LORD your God, with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength" (Deut. 6:4–5), is a declaration of faith in one God. Yahweh desires that individuals and communities have a right relationship with Him. The first line, "Hear, O Israel: The LORD is our God, the LORD alone" is repeated throughout the prayer services. It is like a mantra. Thus the Shema is not only an affirmation of who God is but also a call to be in right relationship with Him.

To compliment the above commandment we read in Lev 19:18: "Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against one of your people, but love your neighbor as yourself. I am the LORD." The central theme of the code is for the Israelites to imitate Yahweh—be holy and be a special people (Lev. 19:2) distinct from the nations around them (19:4). The covenantal community has to respect the alien, the neighbor. The standard of loving neighbor is seen in (Lev. 19:33–36). This calls for the sacrifice of one's "egocentric nature" in order to grow in holiness. Holiness lies in imitating Yahweh and being in right relationship with Him and with other members of the community - vertical and horizontal aspects of love.

The context of this passage is the question: "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?" (Mk. 12:28). In answer, Jesus summarizes the whole teaching of the Scriptures as being right relationships and love. Jesus quotes the Shema of the First/Old Testament and expands the definition of neighbor to include all others those even outside the covenantal community. In doing so, he reveals to his followers the true spiritual transformation one should have. The spiritual transformation is an ongoing process of developing right relationships of love—with God, self, others and the world. Jesus has established the right relationship through the Paschal Mystery. As we celebrate this Eucharistic celebration, let us reorient ourselves to have a right relationship as God wills. ~Fr. Jose
